Welcome all to the March 2016 edition of the Locust Police Department Community Newsletter. It was not my intention to make the newsletter bi-monthly however it just turned out that February and the time that went with it got away from me. It's been business as usual in the city with no major news to report. This newsletter will include some recent crime briefs along with the cumulative statistics from 2015. A breakdown of those stats are included but in brief summary, it shows our city to still be a wonderful place to leave with virtually zero violent crime and a relatively low crime rate overall. Now on to the news.....

RECENT CRIME BRIEFS

- February 21st, Lloyd Anthony Bastfield Jr. of Charlotte took packages of boxer briefs from the Locust Wal-Mart without paying for the items then presented them to customer service as a returned item. Following receiving a fraudulent gift card valued at \$36.17, Bastfield Jr. removed a television valued at \$428 that was located in a promotional display near the entrance of the business before fleeing the scene in a Toyota passenger car. Bastfield Jr. was apprehended after a vehicle pursuit in Cabarrus County by Cabarrus County Sheriff's Deputies. Bastfield Jr. was charged in Stanly County with felony obtaining property by false pretense and misdemeanor larceny. Additional charges were also obtained by the Cabarrus County Sheriff's Office, and all property was recovered. Ms. Julia Potts was also cited by the Locust Police Department for the larceny after she was identified with Bastfield Jr. while he committed the theft.
- February 23rd, Kyong Tae Park of Charlotte arrested on the charges of DWI, felony flee to elude, and speeding. Park was clocked at 76 in a 45 mph zone on West Main Street near Ray Kennedy Drive and did not stop for Locust officers until west of the Rocky River Bridge in Midland. Park blew a .14 level of alcohol concentration on Intox.
- February 24th, Jesse Alexander Baldwin of Stanfield was observed traveling an approximated 45 mph on Ray Kennedy Drive on wet roads. Upon stop, he was determined to be impaired. Baldwin blew a .15 level of alcohol concentration on Intox.
- February 27th, JB James Jones of Charlotte was found to remove a laptop computer from a display case at the Locust Wal-Mart by damaging a metal bracket holding the computer

in place. Jones was arrested later in the evening by Stanly County Sheriff's Deputies and Norwood Police Officers in the Norwood area. He was charged with felony larceny by defeating an anti-theft device.

13 ARRESTED IN STANLY COUNTY MULTI-AGENCY DRUG OPERATION

On February 3, 2016 multiple law enforcement jurisdictions conducted an operation to arrest suspected drug dealers in Stanly County after months of investigation. This criminal investigation is a result of complaints from citizens for offenders who were distributing controlled substances within Stanly County. The investigative efforts resulted in the identification of multiple offenders and their locations. In the course of the operation, 2 search warrants were executed and a total of 13 offenders were arrested. The 13 arrests produced 127 different charges ranging from:

- Possession with Intent to Sell and Deliver Controlled Substances
 Trafficking Controlled Substances
- Conspiracy to Sell and Deliver Controlled Substances
 - Felony Possession of Controlled Substances
 - Sell and Deliver Controlled Substances
 - Maintaining a Dwelling for Controlled Substances

More charges are pending at this time and also the District Attorney's Office will be discussing Habitual Offender indictments on certain individuals. Bonds set for all offenders arrested total approximately \$475,000. Each person arrested is scheduled for their District Court appearance in Stanly County on February 4, 2016 at 9:30AM.

LOCUST VEHICLE PURSUIT RESULTS IN ARREST

At approximately 11 pm on February 1st, Locust officers received a report of a possible impaired driver traveling east on West Main Street in a silver Chevrolet pick-up truck. Locust Officer Dwayne Dietz observed a vehicle fitting that description make a wide turn onto South Central Avenue from West Main traveling toward Stanfield. Officer Dietz observed the vehicle accelerate and he obtained a Radar clock of the vehicle at 78 mph in a 35 mph zone. When Officer Dietz attempted to stop the vehicle, it continued to accelerate while passing vehicles at speeds around 95 mph. Officer Dietz also observed the vehicle to be traveling erratically weaving and at times traveling in the oncoming lane of traffic. Deputy Harwood of the Stanly County Sheriff's Office was then able to join in the pursuit near Coyle Road.

After a pursuit of nearly 4 1/2 miles, the suspect vehicle ran off the road to the right just north of Oak Grove Road in Stanfield. When the vehicle attempted to over-correct, it went into the ditch along the road striking fencing before jumping out of the ditch and snapping a telephone pole in half. The driver, Mr. Marcus Andrade of Marshville attempted to flee the vehicle but he got caught in barbwire fencing in the pasture area in addition to unspecified injuries suffered during the crash influencing him to lay on the ground. Mr. Andrade was taken into custody without incident or further injury despite attempting to resist being handcuffed. Andrade was transported to Stanly Regional Hospital before later being transported to the Carolinas Medical Center. His injuries were unspecified but not considered to be life-threatening. No injuries were suffered by the involved officers and no damage caused to involved patrol vehicles.

Warrants were obtained by Officer Dietz for Mr. Andrade on the charges of felony flee to elude arrest, speeding, driving left of center, reckless driving, and resist, obstruct, and delay of an officer. The North Carolina State Highway Patrol also pursued driving while impaired charges for Mr. Andrade.

Following his release from the hospital, Mr. Andrade turned himself into the Stanly County Jail on February 3rd. He posted a \$5000 bond and was released pending trial.

PRESCRIPTION FRAUD SUSPECT CHARGED

An investigation that began in September of 2015 after a report made by the Locust Medical Pharmacy location resulted in 39 charges by the Locust Police Department and an additional 18 charges by the Albemarle Police Department for a prescription fraud suspect. After investigation, it was determined that Ms. Kelli Nichole Crenshaw, a former employee of NODA Animal Hospital in Charlotte had forged prescriptions for Hydrocodone medication from March 2015 through September 2015. Crenshaw was found to obtain 2,520 Hydrocodone pills through the Locust Medical Pharmacy and an additional 1,740 Hydrocodone pills through the pharmacy of the Albemarle Wal-Mart location during the same time period.

Ms. Crenshaw turned herself in to the Stanly County Jail on January 15th, 2016 where she was issued an initial bond of \$75,000. Her first court date was January 26th, 2016 and her case is still pending.

SPEED LIMIT CHANGE NOTICE

Speed Limit Changes Coming to N.C. 24/27 in Locust

CHARLOTTE – The N.C. Department of Transportation is increasing the speed limit from 35 mph to 45 mph on a 2.2-mile stretch of N.C. 24/27 in Locust.

The department will implement the change on Thursday, Feb. 4, from Kings Drive on westbound N.C. 24/27 to Jenkins Street on eastbound N.C. 24/27. NCDOT studied this stretch of road and determined that the safe and reasonable speed limit, as well as the existing operating speed of motorists, is 45 mph. The speed limit on N.C. 24/27 just beyond these limits is already 45 mph.

On Thursday, NCDOT crews will be working to update existing speed limit signs to reflect the new posted speed. The new speed limit takes effect as soon as the updated signs are installed. Motorists should obey the speed limit at all time and are encouraged to reduce their speed based on conditions.

We as a department understand that very few drivers drive exactly the speed limit, and contrary to some erroneous criticism, we do not write speeding citations for traveling 5 miles over the speed limit inside Locust.

That being said however, the amount of speed discretion the department has utilized when the speed limit was 35 will be lowered now that the speed limit will be 45 across Main Street. The reason for that is that the higher the traveling speed, the higher the possibility of traffic crashes occurring and a higher risk for more serious injuries in those crashes.

Although even one mile over the speed limit is technically a violation of the speed limit law, a few miles over the newly established speed limit most likely will not result in a traffic stop. Please use common sense however when deciding what speed you will travel in the newly established speed zones.



LOCUST POLICE DEPARTMENT 2015 ANNUAL STATISTICS

SUMMARY OF 2014 STATISTICS

OFFENSE TYPES/INCIDENT REPORTS

Law enforcement activities in Locust for 2014 proved to be another banner year for the city in terms of low criminal activity, and continued to show that city residents and visitors enjoy a safe environment, peaceful atmosphere, and "a wonderful place to live, work, and play!" Statistics documented by the Locust Police Department for the 2014 calendar year, although showing a slight increase in overall offense types and documented incident reports, showed another decrease in property crime related calls as well as essentially a non-existent rate of violent crime.

For the year, the Locust Police Department continued with its policies of reports being documented for dispatched calls where interaction with the public occurred. With that policy, the department showed just a slight 2.4% increase in incident reports documented compared to 2013, and offense types contained in these reports also increased by just 3.95%.

General service call types were down 3.6% from the previous year, and these non-criminal call types continue to represent the largest percentage of dispatched calls we receive. General investigation call types were up 15.6% however these types of calls also are usually non-criminal in nature. In general investigations, reports involving missing persons were at nine for the year. It should be noted that no missing person reports involved foul play or legitimate run-away activity, and all reported missing were located.

Most positively for the criminal activity we deal with most often in Locust, call types related to property crime and fraud were down again in 2014. Overall, property and financial crime call

types were down 3.5% from last year. Within this category, reports related to larcenies from businesses went up by just three reports from a year ago, larcenies from residences were down three reports, and activity related to larcenies from vehicles also dropped by six. Reports related to fraud activity also dropped by two compared to 2013. Overall larceny activity for the year showed another decrease from last year with an average daily occurrence in the city of 0.46, a decrease of 3.4% from 2013. Personal larceny activity reports related to persons, vehicles or residences, and not including businesses showed another sizeable decrease and was down 15.8% from 2013. This represents an average daily occurrence of just 0.13 in Locust.

General law enforcement/criminal activity call types were even from last year as 212 total offenses in this category were reported for the second straight year. Within this category, traffic offense related reports increased 9% and property damage offense reports were up 7.8%.

The largest increase for 2014 in offense types occurred in the category related to alcohol and drug offense types. These offense types can mostly be attributed to traffic enforcement and is partially reflected in the increase in citation charges for the year. Offense types related to alcohol and drugs increased from 46 to 87 for the year and points to an increase in DWI and drug enforcement by the department.

In the category related to assault offense types, an increase of nine was recorded compared to a year ago, from 17 to 26. Although this represented a 52.9% increase from 2013, the daily average occurrence remained very low with an average of just 0.07.

Serious crime reports were down to numbers near zero again in 2014. For the year, there were no offenses related to robbery or violent theft activity, and only two offense types related to sexual offenses.

BUSINESS/NEIGHBORHOOD PATROLS

For the majority of the 2014 calendar year, fuel prices continued to stay elevated enough for the department to continue its philosophy of efficient patrol of Locust neighborhoods and businesses. This philosophy results in adequate presence being shown in the city but with efforts being made to limit fuel expenditures and excessive mileage with patrol vehicles. This continued strategy again resulted in a decrease of documented patrols of Locust neighborhoods and businesses compared to 2013 however, 20,216 neighborhood and business patrols were still completed for the 2014 calendar year. Within the perspective of daily patrols; this represented just a decrease of 1.8 patrols conducted on average daily by the department this year as opposed to last. The result of the continued efficient patrol strategy resulted in another small decrease in daily patrols, yet contributed greatly to the department's fuel cost average DECREASE of 12.1% for full-time department patrol vehicles (Based on 2013/2014 budget year vehicle expenditure report).

ARREST CHARGES

Arrest charges in 2014 were 162, up from 128 in 2013. This 26.6% increase can also be attributed heavily to increased traffic enforcement by the department related to alcohol and drug activity. Although some charges may have been the result of outstanding arrest warrants, the

department made 35 arrest charges related to driving while impaired offenses and 23 arrest charges related to different types of drug activity.

CITATION CHARGES

Traffic safety and enforcement remained a priority for the Locust Police Department in 2014, with the primary goal of keeping Locust residents and all motorists safe, as well as an increase in DWI and drug enforcement. Citation charges were up 17.4% for the year; from 1203 in 2013 to 1412 in 2014.

For detractors that hold a perception of excessive traffic enforcement in Locust, despite the 17.4% increase for the year, the 1412 total citation charges represented a daily charge issuance average of just 3.9. In addition, traffic stops recorded by Stanly Communications mobile software showed that 1449 traffic stops conducted in Locust resulted in verbal or written warnings issued, 37 more than the total number of citation charges issued for 2014.

TRAFFIC CRASHES

A new statistic tracked for 2014 was traffic crashes recorded through Stanly Communications mobile software. Total recorded/reported crashes for the year (street/highway and pva/parking lots) in Locust was 134 for a monthly average of 11.2, and a daily average occurrence of just 0.37. No deaths in 2014 occurred as a result of a traffic crash in Locust.
