Parks – Fall sports continued in October. Baseball and softball will conclude at the end of the month with volleyball continuing into November. Basketball registrations began in October. Numbers seem to be in line with previous years. There was a sinkhole that opened beside parking lot next to tennis courts. Park staff along with Public Works were able to make repairs. Staff began planning for 2017 including booking bands and tournaments for athletic complex. Over thirty-five dates were requested from five different sanctioning bodies. Planning continued for the new park bathrooms. Meeting were conducted with several contractors and engineers requesting ideas/pricing for the new facility.

Work continues on the grant proposal for the inclusive park grant the city is applying for. The grant is due December 1, 2016. Park staff began prepping the irrigation system for winter. A proposed recommendation was presented to the Council for the new park bathroom project. The cost will be \$99,600 in conjuction with a \$10,000 grant from the CVB for utilities.
