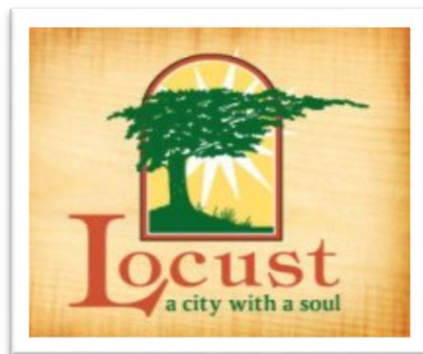

Welcome to the June 2018 edition of the Locust Police Department Community Newsletter. This is the second quarterly newsletter for this year as we find ourselves fully into the hot summer months here in the wonderful city of Locust. Summertime is typically our least favorite months in law enforcement. Aside from wearing a very hot and clingy protective vest in high summer temperatures, it has always seemed the summer brings more criminal activity as opposed to other months of the year. Additionally, like Talladega Speedway where they always have “the big one” nearly every race there, it always seems we have at least one major crime in the summertime each year in Locust. By major crime, I mean an offense or offenses that we typically don’t see on a regular basis in the city. Since I’ve been with the department beginning in 2009, last summer was the first one I recall where that didn’t occur (trust me, I was not complaining).

As I said last time, due to the department Facebook page we are beginning to utilize more frequently as well as more routine updates on the Locust Police Department website, I will readily admit that the newsletter will likely become a less frequent “new news” source. But, I will try to include some additional news tidbits or other reminders to make it a worthwhile read (or skimming if you feel more inclined).

As we get to the halfway mark of 2018, everything seems to have remained relatively steady. Based on projections, it does appear that property crime related reports will likely show an increase by year’s end compared to 2017 however that projected increase at this time does not appear to be a significant one. To counter that statistic, we can report that our department through the end of May was successfully clearing or closing property crime and fraud reports at a 67% clip. This high percentage is partially due to timely and quality reporting by those affected, and partially due to swift response times by our officers. For clarification, a successful closing or clearing of a property crime report involves it being closed by an arrest or other resolution that doesn’t include it still being an open case or leads being exhausted making clearance not possible. Overall for all reports, the Locust Police Department has a close/clear rate of 92.3% through the end of May.

This edition will update department news and activities that have occurred between April and June 2018. March, April, and May 2018 crime stats are included as well. As always, most of the items found in this newsletter can be found on either/both our department website and Facebook page:

Department Training News

In 2017, Locust officers combined for more than 1,000 hours of training and the department has not let up thus far in 2018. As an agency, we strive to have the most well-trained officers in Stanly County and two Locust officers have completed significant training classes since March.

In April, Officer Kevin O'Connor completed a 24-hour sexual assault investigation class that covered all aspects of sexual assault crime from the scene to the courtroom. In May, Officer Hannah Claiborne successfully completed certification as an Intox EC IR/II operator after finishing the 60-hour course with a passing test score. Officer Claiborne, after previously completed standardized field sobriety testing training, can now completely process driving while impaired offenders in Locust. Great job!!

LOCUST OFFICER RECEIVES ADVANCED CERTIFICATION

At the June Locust City Council meeting, Locust Detective Jeff Shew was awarded the advanced law enforcement certification by Locust Chief of Police Frank Hartsell. The advanced law enforcement certification is awarded by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and is the highest training achievement that can be earned by North Carolina law enforcement officers. The advanced certification recognizes extensive training completed by the officer combined with years of service. In Detective Shew's case, his previous achievement of completing his associate's degree at Stanly Community College and bachelor's degree and Western Carolina University along with hundreds of hours of training allowed him to achieve this certification after just eight years of service.

Detective Shew has been full-time with the Locust Police Department since February of 2010. He was a 2013 finalist nominee for Stanly County Officer of the Year by the Officer Jeff Shelton Foundation and was the recipient of the 2014 "Got Your Six" and "Everyday Hero" award from the same organization. Detective Shew previously received his intermediate law enforcement certification also in 2014.

SCAMS REMINDER

A reminder about being alert for the various scams that target our citizens could be made every single month as we routinely each month field inquiry calls and take reports of scam activity. Fortunately, I believe most people have become more educated about the prevalence of the many types of scams therefore the majority of the calls we take are only to report an attempted scam.

Without going into a lengthy diatribe about scam activity, I will sum it up by noting that potential scams can be attempted by phone, through email, through “snail-mail”, or through sites such as Ebay, Amazon, and Craig’s List to name a few. You will want to stay hyper-vigilant any time you receive correspondence that you allegedly owe money or have won something, and if you are buying or selling an item online. As I always say if it’s true good to be true, it most likely is and you should always be suspicious (unfortunately that’s the time period we live in).

Take the extra steps of doing additional research when you receive suspicious correspondence. Make extra check-up phone calls, use the internet to research scams, or even decide only to do any type of business in person.
